In the desire to encourage lay members of congregations to grow in learning, passion, and service, this lay school has established a variety of opportunities and programming to foster such growth.

Life-Long Learning for Lutherans offers classes at multiple sites located throughout the Northeastern Iowa Synod. The courses are produced by SELECT, a video based continuing education program with course presentations by professors from various ELCA seminaries. These classes will be locally facilitated by rostered leaders of the Northeastern Iowa Synod.

The classes are open for participation by rostered leaders as well as lay people who seek educational opportunities to grow in their faith. Participants may register for any class at any site. Registrations are requested by two weeks prior to the start of a course to determine if there are sufficient numbers to hold the class.

Course offerings for 2009-2010 are scheduled October - November and February - May, not including the Thanksgiving and Easter holidays.
