In the past 15 years, money from the fund has been used for travel of various women representatives to India, Israel, Liberia and numerous places in the US. It has also funded scholarships for Triennial participants, investment in the improvement of the WELCA website, Gather magazine and Bold Cafe, purchase of various DVDs for use by staff and others, training in advocacy issues, and grants for the Gbowee Foundation in Liberia. That is pretty amazing for just 15 years. Imagine how much more of a legacy Women of the ELCA can leave if we continue to grow this fund! And definitely true to its namesake! GO AND BE LIKE KATIE!!!
