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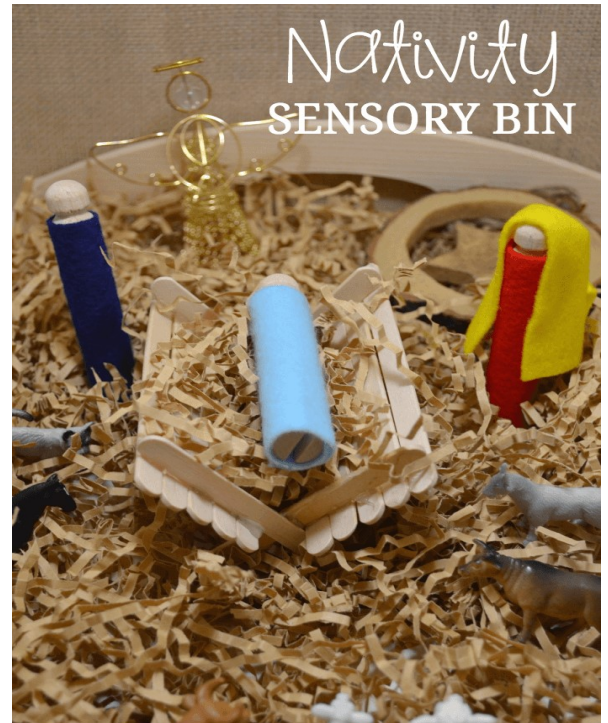
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Sensory Nativity Story Box

Story boxes are great ways to help people interact with stories. You can touch items as you read the story or you can play with the items as you read the story. Here's how to make a sensory nativity story box.

You will need:

- * **A box or basket to hold your Sensory Nativity Story**
- * **Straw or shredded brown paper to represent the manger where Jesus lay**
- * **Wood peg dolls (I just left them plain) to represent Mary, Joseph, Angels, Shepherds, and Magi**
- * **A star ornament to represent the star of Bethlehem**
- * **Gold coin or colored rock to represent the gift of gold given to Jesus. Gold is a gift for a king.**
- * **Frankincense candle or cotton ball dipped in frankincense essential oil to represent the gift of Frankincense given to Jesus. Frankincense was a gift for a priest.**
- * **Myrrh candle or cotton call dipped in myrrh essential oil to represent the gift of Myrrh given to Jesus. Myrrh is a gift used for burial.**
- * **Toy animals to represent the animals at the birth of Jesus**
